To Our Community

Even before Covid-19 emerged, affecting lives around the globe, the healthcare landscape in the U.S. was changing in rapid and unpredictable ways. With a steadfast commitment to delivering reliable behavioral healthcare for L.I.'s most vulnerable, CN Guidance in 2019 once again served a *record* number of clients (nearly 7,000). The agency now employs 360+ people and engages dozens of dedicated volunteers.

Taking an innovative approach toward client health outcomes and long-term agency sustainability, CN Guidance strengthened its capacity in 2019 by: (1) Breaking down barriers to treatment by offering tele-medicine that connects patients directly to clinicians and doctors at our headquarters; (2) Going out into the community to give treatment and vital information to people where they are with our Mobile Recovery Unit; (3) Delivering Mental Health First Aid, Health Insurance Navigation services, and life-saving Narcan trainings across the region; (4) Partnering with The INN Soup Kitchen in Hempstead and Nassau YJCCs; (5) Advancing treatment on demand by improving same-day access (allowing more people to obtain same-day appointments), and significantly reducing wait times; (6) Saving lives of people who have overdosed—through our newly expanded Project Connect program; and (7) Keeping more people out of hospitals with our Crisis Respite and other programs.

This multi-pronged approach has led to improved, integrated physical and behavioral health protocols and health outcomes. Our clients, as a result, experienced earlier treatment, reduced ER usage and hospital readmissions, increased housing stability, greater adherence to vital medications, heightened engagement with substance use treatment, high customer satisfaction, and elevated feelings of wellness, supported by a boosted ability to deal with problems effectively, and more success with employment.

All these great service innovations and outcomes are due to the fantastic work of our dedicated and skilled staff. The people who work here express how much they love the agency, resulting in our being named a *Top Long Island Workplace* by Newsday.

As we move into this new decade, we are continuing to seek and deliver innovative ways to reach more people in need who otherwise would have no access to care. Our emphasis on quality and ongoing adaptation spans the large and small aspects of our presence and services in the community.



New Programs Started/Offered in 2019

During 2019, CN Guidance expanded access and impact by partnering with other community organizations and delivering services in ways that extend beyond the four walls of our CCBHC facility.



Mobile Services

The Centers for Treatment Innovation (COTI) program provides substance use disorder treatment across Nassau County via a mobile recovery unit with telepsychiatry capabilities and a state-of-the-art RV staffed by a registered nurse, case worker, and two clinicians. With three treatment rooms, this unit delivers specialized services and life-saving education in high-needs neighborhoods. Onboard video monitors enable our mobile team to connect patients directly with doctors (psychiatrists) at our Hicksville headquarters. 125 clients; 43 inductions; and 1,915 peer engagements in 2019.

Project Connect - Expansion into Nassau County

In collaboration with Northwell Health, this program saves lives through plans-of-action for treatment, referrals, and accessible appointments for patients who have overdosed and are treated in ERs in Suffolk and (newly) in Nassau. 350+ clients served to date and engaged at over 5 times the national average.

Mental Health First Aid Training (MHFA)

Outreach staff train members of the public on the front lines – teachers, first responders, veterans, medical and social service staffers – to recognize the signs of, and de-escalate, mental health crises, and refer people to needed treatment. Almost 600 people were trained by end of 2019.

Behavioral Health Services at Nassau Jewish Community Centers

Working with the United Jewish Appeal, CNG provides onsite assessments and ongoing counseling to guests struggling with mental health distress and substance use disorders. 80% of those receiving clinical services are reporting a decrease in their symptoms and increase in overall psychosocial satisfaction.

United Healthcare (UHC) Affordable Housing Program

Through a collaboration with UHC and LI Federally Qualified Health Centers, CN Guidance provides stable housing for formerly homeless people and easy access to physical and behavioral health services. 96% of those in the program have avoided inpatient hospitalization.

Health Insurance Navigators

Partnering with the Health and Welfare Council of Long Island, CN Guidance's trained staff engage the community, give presentations, and help low- and moderate-income residents jump through the many hoops necessary to secure health insurance in NY. Have met with 1,369 consumers about their health insurance needs.

Narcan Training

As a registered Opioid Overdose Prevention Program team in NYS, CN Guidance's Narcan-trained staff provided Naloxone/Narcan Training (which helps people survive some types of overdoses) to over 300 individuals, spanning community members, CNG staff, and our own Board of Directors.

Services at The INN

CN Guidance works in Hempstead with The INN (Interfaith Nutrition Network)—which provides many services to housing-unstable guests, who come to The INN's soup kitchen and receive a warm lunch daily and often a brown-bag dinner. CN Guidance provides on-site assessments and ongoing counseling to the guests who are struggling with homelessness, mental health distress, and substance use disorders. Over 250 counseling sessions rendered to date.

In 2019, CN Guidance continued delivering (and fortifying) numerous specialized programs. These services fill gaps and meet a range of needs across individuals. Together, we help our clients overcome hurdles to their sustained stability and thriving.



Care Management Services ("Health Home")

Coordination of care. Helping individuals connect to needed services. In 2019, 87% of clients in this program were highly adherent to their medications.

Residential Services

Group homes, supportive housing, crisis respite, and family housing. Residential services encompass myriad housing environments to support individuals as they advance in their recovery. For example, our Congregate (group) Residences provide 24-hour, on-site staff supervision and needed services, like support groups and counseling. Our Supportive Housing—on the other end of the continuum—helps dozens of people to live mostly independently, in their own apartments across the community.

Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS)

Empowerment/peer supports, individual employment services, psychiatric support and treatment; and educational support services. Outreached and educated 300 agencies, doctors' offices, soup kitchens, colleges, businesses, libraries, community centers, hospitals, counseling centers, and places of worship.

Personalized Recovery-Oriented Services (PROS)

A comprehensive structured program for individuals with serious mental illness. 80% of PROS clients feel better able to deal with crises; report that they are getting along better with family; and report that they are doing better in social situations.

Assertive Community Treatment (ACT/FACT)

Mobile psychiatrist, social worker, nurse, and peer specialist serving high-risk individuals out in the community, using a mobile and team-based approach. FACT works with those interacting with the criminal justice system. ACT/FACT had over 7,000 face-to-face contacts with clients in 2019.

Youth/Young Adult-Oriented Support

Project FORWARD is a program that helps young individuals and couples develop relationship and communication skills. Over 1,400 youth and adults served.

The Northport/East Northport Community Drug and Alcohol Task Force engages parents, teachers, youth, pharmacists, media, police, religious leaders and others to help reduce substance use among youth. See our Color Run event!

Drop-In Center and Starry Night Café

Venues for individuals with developmental and mental health disabilities to socialize and express through art, music, and poetry.



Color Run

This substance use awareness event, co-led by youth on the Northport/East Northport Drug & Alcohol Task Force, kicks off a campaign for Recovery Awareness and Prevention (RAP) Week.


